WHAT'S NEW



- Seniors graduate with an average of
 30% less debt than other local universities.
 (according to the National Center for Education Statistics)
- Received \$2.5 million grant from US government to improve student success.
- Graduate students can now enroll in new PhD program in Leadership.
- Priority Admission to Loma Linda's School of Nursing bachelors program and six other programs.



BEST VALUE



- More than 95% of students receive financial aid that does not need to be repaid.
- \$17,500+ average amount of scholarships and grants awarded annually per student.
- Top two in SDA system for percentage of students who rise from the bottom 20% to the top 20% of the income distribution.





Types of Financial Aid Need Based

- Federal Pell Grant (Free)
- Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG, Free)
- Federal Work Study Program
- Subsidized Federal Direct Loan





Types of Financial Aid Non-Need Based

- Unsubsidized Federal Direct Loans
- Parent PLUS loans
- Private Loans



Federal Aid Prerequisites...

In order to qualify for federal aid, you must have:

- High school diploma, completed homeschooling, or GED
- A valid Social Security Number (Students from the Republic of the Marshall Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, and the Republic of Palau are exempt from the SSN requirement)
- U.S. Citizen or eligible non-citizen status
- Enrollment as a regular student in an eligible program in college
- Must not have been suspended or expelled due to a drug-related conviction
- Males must register with the Selective Service




What is a FAFSA?

Free Application for Federal Student Aid

- A federal evaluation of your family's financial situation.
- EFC Number (Expected Family Contribution): determines how much aid the government, state, or university can award a student
- Must apply electronically at www.studentaid.gov or with the new app "myStudentAid"
- Customer Service:

Can fill FAFSA as early as October 1 of Senior Year of High School


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
















Preparing to Fill Out a FAFSA


Part 1: Apply for a FSA ID

- Create an FSA ID before completing the application https://fsaid.ed.gov/
- Both student and one parent must have their own FSA ID
- An FSA ID gives you access to Federal Student Aid's online systems and can serve as your legal signature
- Only create an FSA ID using your own personal email and information
- Information Needed: Username, Password, Email, & 5 Challenge Questions

Preparing to Fill Out a FAFSA

Part 2: Documents you will need

- Social Security Number
- Driver's license
- 2019 W-2 Forms and other records of money earned
- 2019 Federal Income Tax Return:
 - IRS 1040
 - Foreign Tax Return
- Use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool in the FAFSA
- 2019 untaxed income records
- Current bank statements
- Current business and investment mortgage information, stock, bond, or other investment records
- Alien registration or permanent resident card if not U.S. Citizen



Common FAFSA Errors

Remember these tips to avoid errors!

- Round to the nearest dollar and do not use commas or decimal points
- Do not mail tax forms or worksheets to Federal Student Aid
- Divorced/Remarried parents
- Include the tax/income information of the parent(s) with whom the student lives or lived with for more than half of the year
- Use legal name as printed on Social Security card
- Enter correct Social Security number







Types of State Aid

- Cal Grant A & B
- Dream Act





California Grant (Cal Grant)

To be eligible for this grant, you must:

- Be a California resident
- Have graduated from a California high school
- Have financial need based on your college costs
- Have family income and assets below the established ceilings
- Meet minimum GPA requirements (calculated from Sophomore and Junior years in high school)
- Be enrolled at least half time



Dream Act

California Dream Act

- You are eligible to complete if:
- Undocumented
- Have a valid or expired DACA
- U Visa holders
- Have Temporary Protected Status (TPS)

Cal Grant Categories

Cal Grant A

- Student GPA of 3.0 or above (Sophomore/Junior year)
- Used for tuition and fees
- Private University/La Sierra University
 - > \$9,084 (2020-21)
- Renewable up to 4 years (maintain 2.0 GPA, meet Income & Asset Ceilings annually)

Cal Grant B/Access

- Student GPA of 2.0 or above (Sophomore/Junior year)
- Used for book and supplies
- \$1,656 (2020-21) Access amount (Freshman Year)
- After Freshman year, Cal Grant B pays in the amount of Cal Grant A (\$9,084) + Access amount (\$1,656) = \$10,740



Cal Grant A & B Eligibility Caps...

To be eligible for a Cal Grant, you must fit into the following Income & Asset Ceilings (based on 2021-22 school year)

Family Size	A	В
Six or more	\$127,700	\$70,100
Five	\$118,400	\$65,000
Four	\$110,400	\$58,100
Three	\$101,700	\$52,200
Two	\$99,200	\$46,300
Independent	\$40,500	\$40,500
Married	\$46,300	\$46,300

Asset ceiling (not including primary residence):

Dependent: \$85,500 Independent: \$40,700
